Results of Racism and Shared Society Poll among Jewish and Arab Israelis

General

The poll was conducted between September 17 and 23, 2014 by the Panels Research Institute in order to examine positions in Israel towards racism and the concept of a shared society.

The poll was conducted among 594 Israeli citizens (Jews and Arabs according to their relative share of the population).

The poll was conducted via the Internet panel Panel4all.

Maximum sampling error: ±4.1%.

Summary of the results:

As in a poll conducted in March 2014, 80% of the respondents think that there is racism against Ethiopian Jews in Israel and more than two thirds think that there is racism against Arabs in Israel. Only 4% think that there is no racism at all in Israel.

Education against racism and for a shared society is perceived as the most effective way to bring Jews and Arabs closer together (56% of the respondents). Another 49% of the respondents indicate that they consider meaningful encounters between Jewish and Arab students throughout their years at school as an effective way to bring Jews and Arabs in Israel closer together.

As in the poll conducted in March 2014, also in the poll at hand the majority of the respondents expect the education system to act initiatively and continuously against racism and for a shared society of Jews and Arabs in Israel.

However, the number of respondents who believe that teachers are not supposed to relate to the issue of racism and shared society has grown significantly in comparison to the previous poll (11% now in comparison to 1% in March).
